Testing in Nottingham

Testing is where we do a test to see who has coronavirus. Some people are tested more than once.

Between 6 December 2023 and 12 December 2023, there have been **107** tests. This shows a decrease of **48.6**% compared to the previous 7 days.

Cases in Nottingham

A confirmed case is someone who has tested positive for coronavirus.

Between 3 December 2023 and 9 December 2023, **0 - 2** people had a confirmed positive test result. This shows a decrease of **999999.0**% compared to the previous 7 days.

Vaccinations in Nottingham

11,213 people had been given a spring booster by the end of 13 December 2023.

Healthcare in Nottingham University Hospitals

Some people with coronavirus have to go into hospital.

Between 2 December 2023 and 8 December 2023, **31** went into hospital with coronavirus. This shows an increase of **29.2**% compared to the previous 7 days.

There were **36** patients in hospital with coronavirus on 8 December 2023.

Some people in the hospital need to use a special device called a mechanical ventilator to help them breathe.

There was 1 coronavirus patient in hospital beds with a mechanical ventilator on 31 May 2023.

Deaths in East Midlands

Between 11 November 2023 and 17 November 2023, there have been **13** deaths with COVID-19 on the death certificate. This shows a decrease of **50.0%** compared to the previous 7 days.
